The meeting concluded with Vikki DeGaa giving an update on the Westmoreland Street Plaza project on S.E. Claybourne Street, in the half block just west of Milwaukie Avenue. The street painting which is to be the first step in the contemplated public plaza is to take place on the weekend of July 26-27.

There being no other business on the agenda, or offered from the floor, Pat Hainley moved the meeting be adjourned, and Jim Friscia seconded the motion – which then carried with evident unanimity at 8:30 p.m.
